





Donald Trump was convicted on felony charges. Will he go to prison?

A New York jury's historic conviction of Donald Trump on felony charges means his fate is now in the hands of the judge he's repeatedly ripped as "corrupt" and "incompetent.

Two experts told NBC News that it's unlikely Trump will be imprisoned based on his age, lack of a criminal record and other factors — and an analysis of thousands of cases found that very few people charged with the same crime receive jail time. But a third expert told NBC News he believes it is "substantially" likely Trump could end up behind bars.

Trump was convicted on 34 counts of falsifying business records, a class E felony that is punishable by a fine, probation or up to four years in prison. During the trial, Judge Juan Merchan threatened to put



Trump behind bars for violating his gag order, but it's unclear if the former president will face similar consequences now.

Former federal prosecutor Chuck Rosenberg, an NBC News analyst, said it's unlikely that Merchan would sentence Trump, 77, to any

jail time, given his age and his status as a first-time, nonviolent offender. "I'd be very surprised if there's any sentence of incarceration at all," Rosenberg said. "Of course, he did spend a good bit of time insulting the judge who has the authority to incarcerate him."

The next step for Trump at this point


is his sentencing, which is set for July

Arthur Aidala, a former prosecutor in the Brooklyn district attorney's office who's now a defense lawyer, said the judge will likely use some of the time before sentencing to research similar cases to determine what the median sentence is.

"He wants to know before he sentences someone what the typical sentence is," Aidala said, and would consider other factors like Trump's age and lack of criminal record, while also taking into account the lack of injury caused by the crime. Aidala said he believes whatever punishment the judge comes up with would be "a non-jail disposi-



MEKATIJI WA MENZA

Mekatilili wa Menza, fearless worrior leader who resisted the British colonisation in Kenya

he was born in Mutsara wa Tsatsu between 1840 and 1860. She was the only girl among five children and named Mnyazi wa Menza (Mnyazi,

daughter of Menza) by her parents. She was named Mekatilili after her son Katilili now me -mother of Katilili.

When she was a young girl, her grandma used to tell her the tales about the coming of white men which were foretold by a Midzi-Chenda a Mijikenda prophetess named Mepoho. She knew from the prophecy the foreigners would come to oppress her people, destroy their culture, but a woman will stand for them.Photo Courtesy of Rich

Mekatilili interacted with Arabs Mand British in Malindi and great market near Kilifi trading with them. Her resentment towards foreigners was triggered by her personal tragedy which has been attributed as being responsible for forced labour and oppression.

During her trading visits, Mekatilili saw one of her brother named Mwarandu taken captive by Arab slave merchants, this left deep psychological scar on her.

Traditionally married to Dyeka wa Duka in Bungale, Mekatilili was an active and prominent member of traditional women groups in the community such as Hifudu and Makushekushe which she rose to head later on. Following the death of her husband, she had more freedom as a woman leader to move around and rally the people. Mekatilili had great oratory skills and along with her

charisma and bravery she led public meetings called baraza, mobilizing the men to take



oaths and make sacrifices to restore their sovereignty. At a baraza in August 1913, Mekatilili got into a heated argument with the British administrator, Arthur Champion whom she slapped!

Swiftly, the Giriama men rallied to defend their heroine and were ready to deal with the British official who was taken away. The British responded by firing shots at the gathering crowd. Realizing their initial miscalculation in underestimating Mekatilili's influence, the British plotted and succeeded in arresting her along with Wanje wa Mwadorikola on October 17, 1913.

Mekatilili and Wanje, a male activist were sentenced to five years imprisonment and were taken to Kisii, about 1,000km away. However in April 1914, the pair escaped and found their way back home, which was a big shock to the British who could not understand how a woman could have walked the distance and

through a thick forest and survived the wild animals.

Mekatilili continued where she had left off and this ultimately led to the Giriama uprising of October 25, 1914 where many Giriama people were killed by the British who also burnt Kaya Fuongo, the spiritual capital of the Giriama. Mekatilili was re-arrested and sent this time up north near the border area with Somalia.

Although the British had the upper hand, they were unable to gain total control and eventually, yielded to the demands of the Giriama people. Mekatilili returned five years after the revolt. She died at around 1925. However, it was not until October 20, 2010 at the celebration of the first Mashujaa (Heroes) Day that the legendary woman was honored and recognized among Kenya's freedom fighters!

The government erected her statue at Uhuru Gardens in

Nairobi which was renamed

Mekatilili wa Menza

Gardens.

One of Mekatilili's most famous acts of rebellion saw her attend a meeting held on 13 August 1913 by British administrator Arthur Champion, who was attempting to recruit the Giriama youth for service in the First World War. Mekatilili entered the meeting with a hen and chicks in her hand, challenging Champion to take one of the chicks from her. When he reached out, the mother hen then pecked at the administrator's hand, humiliating him in public. As the hen pecked Champion, Mekatilili told him: 'This is what you will get if you try to take one of our sons.'

Believed to have been born in the 1840s in Kilifi County, Mekatilili wa Menza became politically active between 1912 and 1915, leading the Giriama people against British colonial forces.[1] Most of Mekatilili's activism therefore began when she was in her seventies. Around that time, the British authorities began to increase economic pressures on the Giriama people by implementing 'hut taxes' and by attempting to control the palm wine and ivory trade. They also attempted to recruit as workforce young Giriama men, taking them away from the land near the Sabaki river

Bribe Can Be Costly Retired Four-Star Admiral Charged With **Accepting Bribes For Contracts**

A former U.S. Navy vice chief of naval operations was arrested Friday on charges that he accepted bribes to steer government contracts to a company in exchange for a future job while still in service, Justice Department (DOJ) officials announced in a statement.

Retired Navy Adm. Robert Burke, 62, of Coconut Creek, Fla., and two business executives, Yongchul "Charlie" Kim and Meghan Messenger, both of New York, were each charged with bribery and conspiracy to commit bribery, according to the unsealed indictment. In addition, Burke is charged with "performing acts affecting a personal financial interest and concealing material facts from the United States," the DOJ statement notes.


If convicted, Burke faces a maximum penalty of 30 years in prison, while Kim and Messenger each face a maximum penalty of 20 years in prison. Burke, who has served aboard attack and ballistic missile submarines, rose through the ranks to eventually become the 40th vice chief of naval



operations in June 2019 before taking command of U.S. Naval Forces Europe-Africa and Allied Joint Forces Command in June 2020.

Kim and Messenger, meanwhile, were co-CEOs of a business, referred to by the Justice Department as "Company A" that provided a workforce training pilot program to a small component of the Navy from August 2018 through July 2019. A website for services firm NextJump lists a Charlie Kim and a Meghan Messenger as co-CEOs. The Navy ended a contract with Company A in late 2019 and directed it not to contact Burke. In July 2021, however, while Burke was overseeing thousands of Navy civilians and military personnel in Europe and Africa, Kim and Messenger allegedly met with him in Washington, D.C., in an effort to reestablish Company A's business relationship with the Navy, according to the statement.

Stuck At Sea For Years, A Sailor's Plight Highlights A Surge In Shipowner Abandonment.



er at ports along the Red Sea.

By night, he tossed and turned in his bunk on the aging Al-Maha, he said, thinking of the unpaid wages he feared he'd never get if he left the ship. By day he paced the deck, stuck for the last two years in the seaport of Jeddah, unable to set foot on land because of Saudi Arabia's strict immigration laws.

Leaving at last felt like returning to his "center of gravity," he said.

Saleh's plight is part of a global problem that shows no signs of abating. The United Nations has logged an increasing number of crew members abandoned by shipowners, leaving sailors aboard months and sometimes years without pay. More than 2,000 seafarers on some 150 ships were abandoned last year.

The number of cases is at its highest since the U.N.'s labor and maritime organizations began tracking abandonments 20 years ago, spiking during the global pandemic and continuing to rise as inflation and logistical bottlenecks increased costs for shipowners. Cases have touched all parts of the globe, with workers abandoned on a fish factory ship in Angola, stranded on an icebreaker in the Neth-



erlands and left without food or fuel in Istanbul.

Yet the nations that register these ships and are required by treaty to assist abandoned seafarers sometimes fail to get involved in the cases at all. Tanzania, which registered the ship where Saleh was abandoned, never acted on his case or even responded to emails, said Mohamed Arrachedi, a union organizer who worked on Saleh's case.

Shipowners often abandon crew members when they are hit by rising fuel costs, debt or unexpected repairs they can't afford. Some owners vow to pay when their finances turn around. But those promises can mean little to the men on board, who often resort to handouts for food and basic supplies. Many are also supporting families back home and risk losing everything if they step off their ships.

Crew members or the countries where the ships are registered or docked can pursue the shipowners in court. But recovering past wages can be a yearslong battle that often fails.

Returning to Egypt in April was joyous, Saleh, 62, told The Associated Press, but also brought sad news. His wife and son were badly in need of medical care, he said. They had struggled during his decade without an in-

Saleh, who was originally from Syria, said he had once been proud of his work as an engineer on the Al-Maha, which made its money ferrying livestock for Ramadan festivities between Sudanese and Saudi Arabian ports. From tip to tail, the Al-Maha spans the length of a football field, covered in dust and dirt and rusted green paint. While stuck in Saudi Arabia, Saleh and a small group of crewmates, also from war-torn Syria, placed a prayer mat in the pilothouse overlooking the port. A stray cat they named Apricot took up residence on the ship and followed Saleh around. AP News

Months after nation's 1st nitrogen gas execution, Alabama gives man lethal injection for 2 killings.

Alabama man received a lethal injection Thursday for the 2004 deaths of an el-

derly couple who police said were attacked with a hammer, machete and tire tool during a robbery at their home.

Jamie Ray Mills, 50, was pronounced dead at 6:26 p.m. after a three-drug injection at a southwest Alabama prison, authorities said.

Mills was the first inmate put to death by the state since Alabama became the first in the nation to execute an inmate using nitrogen gas months ago. Lethal injection remains Alabama's default execution method unless a condemned inmate requests nitrogen gas or the electric chair.

Mills was convicted of capital murder in the deaths of Floyd Hill, 87, and his wife Vera Hill, 72. Prosecutors said they were attacked on June 24, 2004, at their home in Guin about 80 miles (130 kilometers) northwest of Birmingham during a robbery where \$140 and prescription drugs were stolen.



"Tonight, two decades after he committed these murders, Jamie Mills has paid the price for his heinous crimes. I pray for the victims and their loved ones," Alabama Gov. Kay Ivey said in a statement.

As the execution began, Mills gave a thumbs up to family members, who were watching from a witness room.

"I love my family. I love my brother and sister. I couldn't ask for more," Mills said as he looked in the direction of his brother and sister. He also thanked his attorney, Charlotte Morrison of the Equal Justice Initiative. "Charlotte, you fought hard for me. I love y'all. Carry on."

Some of his relatives cried softly through the execution.

As the first execution drug — a sedative — flowed, Mills appeared to quickly lose consciousness as a spiritual adviser prayed at the foot of the gurney.

In 2007, a jury convicted Jamie Mills of capital murder and voted 11-1 for the death sentence that was imposed by a judge.

Floyd Hill was the primary caregiver for his wife, who was diabetic and in poor health. He kept her medications in a tackle box in the couple's kitchen. The Hills regularly held yard sales to supplement their income. When the couple's granddaughter couldn't them, officers arrived to find them in pools of blood in the backyard shed where they stored yard sale items.

Floyd Hill died from wounds to the head and neck and Vera Hill died about 12 weeks later from complications of head trauma, according to court filings. Investigators said the tacklebox, murder weapons and bloody clothes were later found in the trunk of Mills' car. Members of the victims' family witnessed the execution and issued a statement that "justice has been served" after a 20-year wait.

"Our family now can have some closure to this heinous crime that he committed and our loving grandparents can rest in peace. Let this be a lesson for those that believe justice will not find you. Hopefully, this will prevent others from committing future crimes. God help us all," the statement from the Hill and Freeman families read.

At the 2007 trial, JoAnn Mills became the key witness against her common-law husband. She testified that after staying up all night smoking methamphetamine, her husband took her along to the victims' home where she testified she saw her husband repeatedly strike the couple in the backyard shed, court documents indicate.

Texas Supreme Court rejects challenge to state's abortion law over medical exceptions.

The court ruled that state law does not require that a woman's death or serious impairment be "imminent" when being evaluated by a doctor for an abortion.

BIDEN HIGHLIGHTS



The split in the Democrats' approach to the war has become stark in recent weeks, leading to tension among liberal lawmakers.

Pro-Israel House Democrats have expressed solidarity with the embattled nation while Biden and progressive lawmakers have shown skepticism, if not outrage, over Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's plans to invade Rafah.

In a rebuke to the White House, House Democrats teamed up with Republicans to pass the bill to force Biden's hand, highlighting the precarious position some left-leaning lawmakers find themselves in over their support for Israel.



Court on Friday rejected a closely watched challenge to the state's restrictive abortion ban, ruling against a group of women who had serious pregnancy complications and became the first in the U.S. to testify in court about being denied abortions since Roe v.

Wade was overturned.

In a unanimous ruling, the all-Republican court upheld the Texas law that opponents say is too vague when it comes to when medically necessary exceptions are allowed. The same issue was at the center of a separate lawsuit brought last year by Kate Cox, a mother of two from Dallas, who sought court permission to obtain an abortion after her fetus developed a fatal condition during a pregnancy that resulted in multiple trips to an emergency room.

Abortion rights activists have struggled to stem the tide of restrictions that have taken effect in most Republican-led states since the U.S. Supreme Court in 2022 overturned Roe



vs Wade, which for nearly 50 years had affirmed the constitutional right to an abortion.

The court said the law's exceptions, as written, are broad enough and that doctors would be misinterpreting the law if they declined to perform an abortion when the mother's life is in danger.

"Texas law permits a life-saving abortion," the court wrote in the order signed by Justice Jane Bland.

The decision appeared to close, at least for now, another pathway for opponents who have sought to force the state to provide more clarity about when exceptions are allowed. Last year, plaintiffs in the lawsuit gave emotional accounts

in an Austin courtroom over how they carried babies they knew would not survive and continued pregnancies that put their health in worsening danger.


"Now we know the courthouse doors are closed to them," said Molly Duane, a staff attorney for the Center for Reproductive Rights, which represented the Texas women. "It seems Texans have nowhere to go but the voting booth, in terms of what comes next."

Under the law in Texas, doctors who perform abortions risk life in prison, fines of up to \$100,000 and revocation of their state medical licenses.

A lower court in 2023 had

granted a temporary injunction preventing Texas from enforcing the ban against doctors who in their "good faith judgment" ended a pregnancy that they determined was unsafe because of complications. But that was immediately blocked by an appeal from the Texas attorney general's office to the state's Supreme Court.





Biden Details a Three-Phase Deal Aimed at Winding Down the Israel-Hamas War.

ashington — President Joe Biden on Friday detailed a three-phase deal proposed by Israel to Hamas militants that he says would lead to the release of the remaining hostages in Gaza and could end the grinding, nearly 8-month-old Mideast war.

Biden added that Hamas is "no longer capable" of carrying out another large-scale attack on Israel as he urged Israelis and Hamas to come to a deal to release the remaining hostages for an extended cease-fire.

The Democratic president in remarks from the White House called the proposal "a road map to an enduring cease-fire and the release of

Israel has faced growing international criticism for its strategy of systematic destruction in Gaza, at a huge cost in civilian lives. Israeli bombardments and ground offensives in the besieged territory have killed more than 36,000 Palestinians, according to Gaza's Health Ministry, which does not distinguish between combatants and civilians.

Biden said the first phase of the proposed deal would would last for six weeks and would include a "full and complete cease-fire," a withdrawal of Israeli forces from all populated areas of Gaza and the release of a number of hostages, including women, the elderly and the wounded, in exchange for the release of hundreds of Palestinian prisoners.

American hostages would be released at this stage, and remains of hostages who have been killed would be returned to their families. Humanitarian assistance would surge during the first phase, with 600 trucks being allowed into Gaza each day. The second phase would include the release of all remaining living hostages, including male soldiers, and Israeli forces would withdraw from Gaza.

"And as long as Hamas lives up to its commitments, the temporary cease-fire would become, in the words of the Israeli proposals, 'the cessation of hostilities permanently," Biden said.

The third phase calls for the start of a major reconstruction of Gaza, which faces decades of rebuilding from devastation caused by the war. The 4-1/2 page Israeli proposal was transmitted to Hamas on Thursday.

But Biden acknowledged that keeping the deal on track would be difficult, saying there are a number of "details to negotiate" to move from the first phase to the second.

One roadblock to overcome during the first phase would involve the two sides agreeing on ratio of hostages to prisoners to be released during the next phase, according to a senior Biden administration official who briefed reporters on the condition of anonymity.

Biden's remarks came as the Israeli military confirmed that its forces are now operating in central parts of Rafah in its expanding offensive in the southern Gaza city. Biden called it "a truly a decisive moment." He added that Hamas said it wants a cease-fire and that an Israe-li-phased deal is an opportunity to prove "whether they really mean it."

Also, get emergency help right away if you have chest pain, especially if you also have shortness of breath; jaw, back, shoulder or arm pain; sweating; dizziness; or nausea. These may be warning signs of a heart attack and not simply stress symptoms.

When you face a perceived threat, a tiny region at the brain's base, called the hypothalamus, sets off an alarm system in the body. An example of a perceived threat is a large dog barking at you during your morning walk. Through nerve and hormonal signals, this system prompts the adrenal glands, found atop the kidneys, to release a surge of hormones, such as adrenaline and cortisol.

Adrenaline makes the heart beat faster, causes blood pressure to go up and gives you more energy. Cortisol, the primary stress hormone, increases sugar, also called glucose, in the bloodstream, enhances the brain's use of glucose and increases the availability of substances in the body that repair tissues.




