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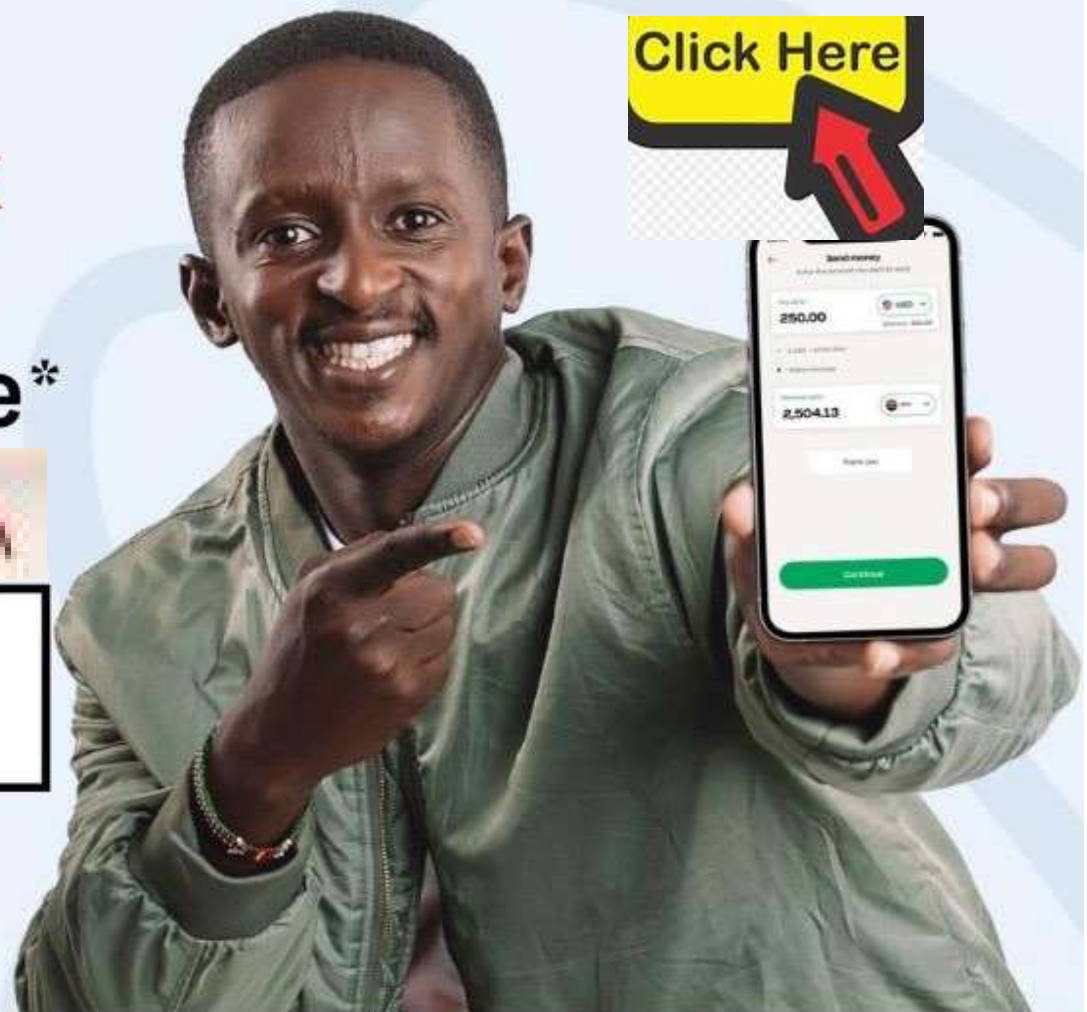

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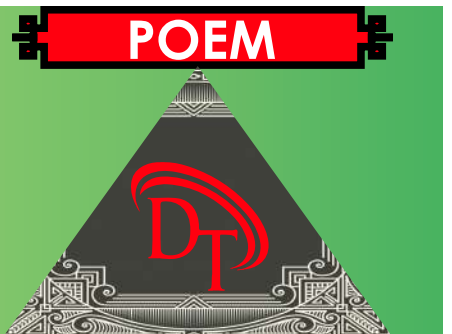

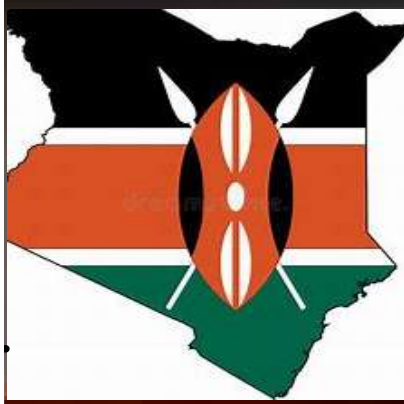

Rest In Peace

Alexander Kipsang Muge

On August 14, 1990, at age 44, Muge lost his life in a collision with a truck near Kipkaren, Uasin Gishu district. He had ignored multiple warnings from Minister for Labor Mr. Habenga Okondo that he “would not leave the area” lending credibility to speculation that his collision was not really an accident.

K Alexander Kipsang Muge (1948–1990) was an Anglican bishop in Kenya: he was Bishop of Eldoret from 1983 until his death in 1990.

Muge was born in 1948 and educated at St. Philip's, Maseno. He was ordained deacon in 1975 and priest in 1976. He served at St. Stephen, Nairobi and then at All Saints' Cathedral, Nairobi.

Muge became a critic of Daniel arap Moi and advocated for civil rights in Kenya. His death in a car accident is widely regarded as suspicious.

Early life

Alexander Kipsang Muge was born in March of 1948 to Anna Chepkoskei who went by the moniker “the woman of the dusty roads.” (A moniker born from her efforts of fetching firewood for her children) Born into the Kamelilo Clan, Kipsang was known to refuse the common traditions of his clan and would often abstain from ceremonies as a child, much to the astonishment of the clan elders. This refusal remains a mystery in light of his lack of Christian faith at the time.

According to his mother, Kipsang was a child who loved the solitude of the forest and possessed an ever-inquisitive spirit. His father, recognising his ability, enrolled him into the Africa Inland Church Primary School at Tangaratwet where he received exemplary marks in his fourth year common entrance examination in 1962. Later, Kipsang studied at the Anglican Mission School where he passed the Kenya Primary Education Examination.

Early Christian Faith

Kipsang was converted and

baptized on October 25, 1970, at St. Michael and All Angels Church in Ruiru by Rev. John Kago. As a soldier at the time, Kipsang proclaimed to have previously lived a life of sin which changed after a personal encounter with Christ. He was encouraged by born again Christians to pursue the path of faith to its ultimate end and from then on, Kipsang became totally devoted to the revival movement.

In 1973, Kipsang resigned from his work as a soldier and began his studies at St. Philip's Maseno Bible School. In 1975, he was ordained as a deacon at St. Stephen's Church, Jogoo Road, in Nairobi. The following year, he was ordained as a priest and became a curate there. Later, he served as a priest at St. Mark's Church, Westland, Nairobi, before attending London Bible School in Britain in 1979. Whilst in London he also held the position of secretary for the Pan-African Student Body. He gradu-

ated from the London Bible School in June 1982 with a bachelor of arts in divinity, returning to Kenya right after. He rejoined the diocese of Nairobi and on July 1 of that same year, was appointed assistant provost of All Saints Cathedral. Muge served at All Saints for eleven months before being appointed bishop of the newly created diocese of Eldoret on June 5, 1983.

As a Bishop, Muge maintained his stalwart vision for Kenya. He devoted his life to the advocacy and proclamation of social truths and embodied the notion of the power of the pulpit to transform and reform society. Nicholas Otieno, in his book about Muge mentions that “When Muge set out for a mission, however dangerous it was, no one, not even his family could stop him. He was a man of depth and total commit-

ment to the cause of truth. He had faith beyond the fear of death”.

Bishop Muge had a particular focus on defending the poor and oppressed children of God. Being a part of the military previously, Muge often conceptualized his vocation as a watchman looking over the flock.

Muge held a traditional interpretation of Scripture. On May 17, 1990, during a visit to the USA, he openly condemned homosexuality, appealing to the authority of Scripture in its classic understanding which, he said, must not be compromised. Muge was a firm anti-corruption advocate for the church calling it the nation's conscience which needs to remain clear.

On 14th August 1990, a grisly road accident on the Nairobi-Eldoret Highway was profiled as a singular entry into the daily quota of road accidents on this stretch.

Outspoken Anglican Bishop Alexander Muge, aged 44 years, lost his life in an accident, that was in essence an assassination.

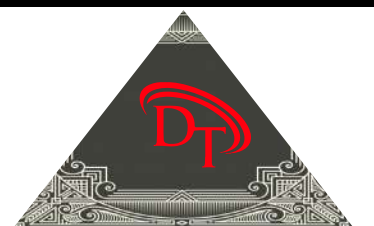
This was revealed by a former intelligence officer in an inquest formed by the Truth, Justice and Reconciliation Commission (TJRC).

The country's political scene in the late 1980s was volatile, picture a field lined with mines.

The former president Daniel Moi had the grip of power, in a one-party rule system - Kenya African National Union (KANU).

There was a push to amend the constitution to allow a multi-party political system, an independent judiciary, protection of tenure for the Attorney General and Auditor-General, a secret ballot for elections, and a limit on the tenure of office for the president to two five-year terms.

Hamas political leader and Hezbollah commander killed hours apart.

The leaders of two different Iranian-backed groups, Hamas and Hezbollah, were killed in separate attacks within 24 hours of each other this week.

Hamas said its political leader, Ismail Haniyeh, was killed in an airstrike Wednesday in Tehran, where he had traveled to attend the inauguration of Iran's president. On Tuesday, senior Hezbollah commander Fuad Shukur was killed in an Israeli strike in the outskirts of Beirut.

In response to the killing of Haniyeh, Iran's supreme leader, Ayatollah Ali Khamenei, ordered a direct strike on Israel, the New York Times reported.

Hamas, the militant government Palestinians elected in Gaza, orchestrated an unprecedented attack on Israel on Oct. 7 that killed nearly 1,200 people and resulted in Israel's military response that has killed more than 39,000, according to Palestinian health authorities. For decades, Hezbollah, a heavily armed militia group based in Lebanon, has launched rockets into Israel. Both groups are backed by Iran.

Now, fears of wider Middle East conflict are growing. The U.S. State Department released an advisory Wednesday warning Americans not to travel to Lebanon "due to rising tensions between [Hezbollah] and Israel."

Here's what we know about what has happened in the Middle East:

Haniyeh was primarily living in Qatar, where he played a key part in the ongoing indirect Israel-Hamas ceasefire negotiations that have been brokered by Qatar, Egypt and the U.S.

Haniyeh was killed by a rocket strike in the early morning hours on Wednesday in an apparent assassination at his residence in Tehran after he attended a swearing-in ceremony for the new Iranian president, according to Hamas. NY Times

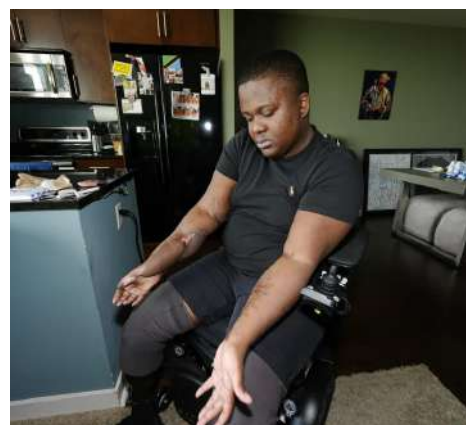
Police recruit who lost both legs in 'barbaric hazing ritual' sues Denver, paramedics and officers.

A police recruit who had to have both of his legs amputated after losing consciousness and repeatedly collapsing during fight training at Denver's police academy is suing those who allegedly forced him to continue the "barbaric hazing ritual" after paramedics ignored warning signs.

Victor Moses, 29, alleges in a lawsuit filed Tuesday that aggressive officers knocked him down multiple times in the second round of "fight day" last year, with one of them shoving him off the mat and causing him to hit his head on the floor. He said he was pressured to continue, with officers picking him up and setting him back on his feet, before paramedics standing by were asked to check him out, the lawsuit said.

Moses told them he had the sickle cell trait, which puts him at an increased risk of medical complications from high-intensity exercise. He also said he had very low blood pressure and complained that his legs were cramping, according to the lawsuit. The symptoms are danger signs for people with his condition.

Nevertheless, paramedics cleared Moses to return to training, which the suit



alleges was a decision made to support the police.

The type of training described in the lawsuit is common in the United States and helps prepare recruits for scenarios they could face on patrol, said Ian Adams, an assistant professor of criminology and criminal justice at the University of South Carolina. Minor injuries are common and occasionally recruits die, often because of an underlying medical condition, he said.

Both the Denver Police Department and Denver Health, the public hospital that employed the paramedics, declined to comment on the allegations, saying they could not address pending litigation. "Safety and well-being is a top priority for Denver Health and its paramedics," the hospital said in a statement.

A telephone call and email seeking com-

ment was also left with the city attorney's office.

All recruits must complete the training to prepare them physically and mentally for fights they could encounter on the street. It includes having recruits punch and kick a dummy or a trainer holding pads, using a padded baton to fight trainers, wrestling and practicing to arrest a suspect who assaults them, according to the lawsuit.

The legal action alleges the practice is an unnecessarily violent rite of passage that recruits have to endure to be accepted into the police "fraternity." It notes that other recruits suffered injuries before Moses started his drills, including one person whose nose was broken.

The lawsuit also claims that training teaches recruits that excessive force is "officially tolerated, and indeed culturally expected."

Moses' lawyers, John Holland and Darold Killmer, say that mindset has nurtured a violent police force and led to lawsuits costing Denver millions of dollars.

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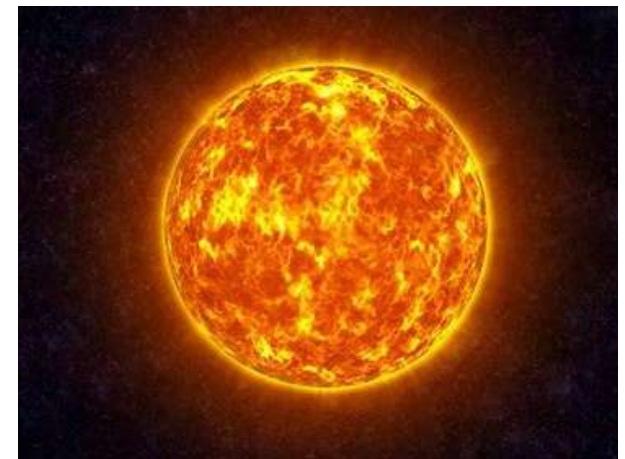
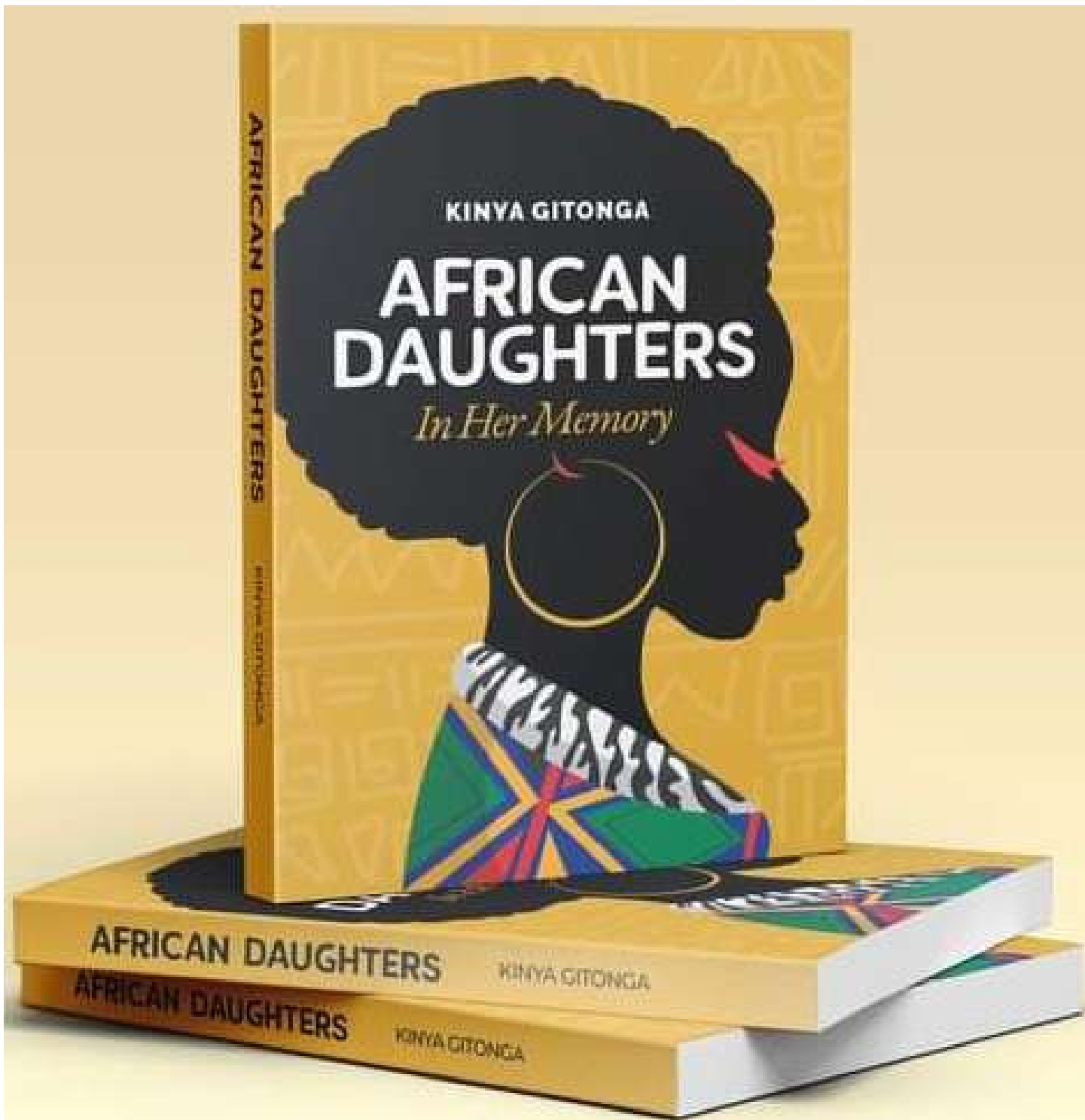

Airlines would no longer be allowed to charge parents extra fees for their kids to be seated next to them under a new rule proposed by the Biden administration. White House officials say their "fee-free family seating" proposal could potentially save parents up to \$200 per round trip flight.

"Families don't need any additional stresses or costs when flying on top of how demanding it can be to be a parent flying with your kids," Transportation Secretary Pete Buttigieg told reporters when announcing the proposed rule.

Buttigieg said, "The idea that parents ought to be seated next to their own children on a flight is common sense and also seems like something that ought to be standard practice."

US presidential candidate Donald Trump has stirred a new racial controversy after asserting that Vice President Kamala Harris turned to her Black identity recently out of political expediency.

Speaking at a convention of Black journalists in Chicago on Wednesday, the former president claimed that Harris, the first Black woman and Asian American to serve as vice president, had promoted her Indian heritage until very recently. What did Trump say at the NABJ Convention?

"I didn't know she was Black until a number of years ago when



she happened to turn Black and now she wants to be known as Black. So, I don't know, is she Indian or is she Black?" Trump said during a panel at the National Association of Black Journalists (NABJ) Convention.

"I've known her a long time indirectly, not directly very much, and she was always of Indian heritage," Trump said. "I respect either one, but she obviously doesn't, because she was Indian all the way, and then all

of a sudden she made a turn and she went - she became a Black person," he said. "I think somebody should look into that, too." Aljazeera reports share.

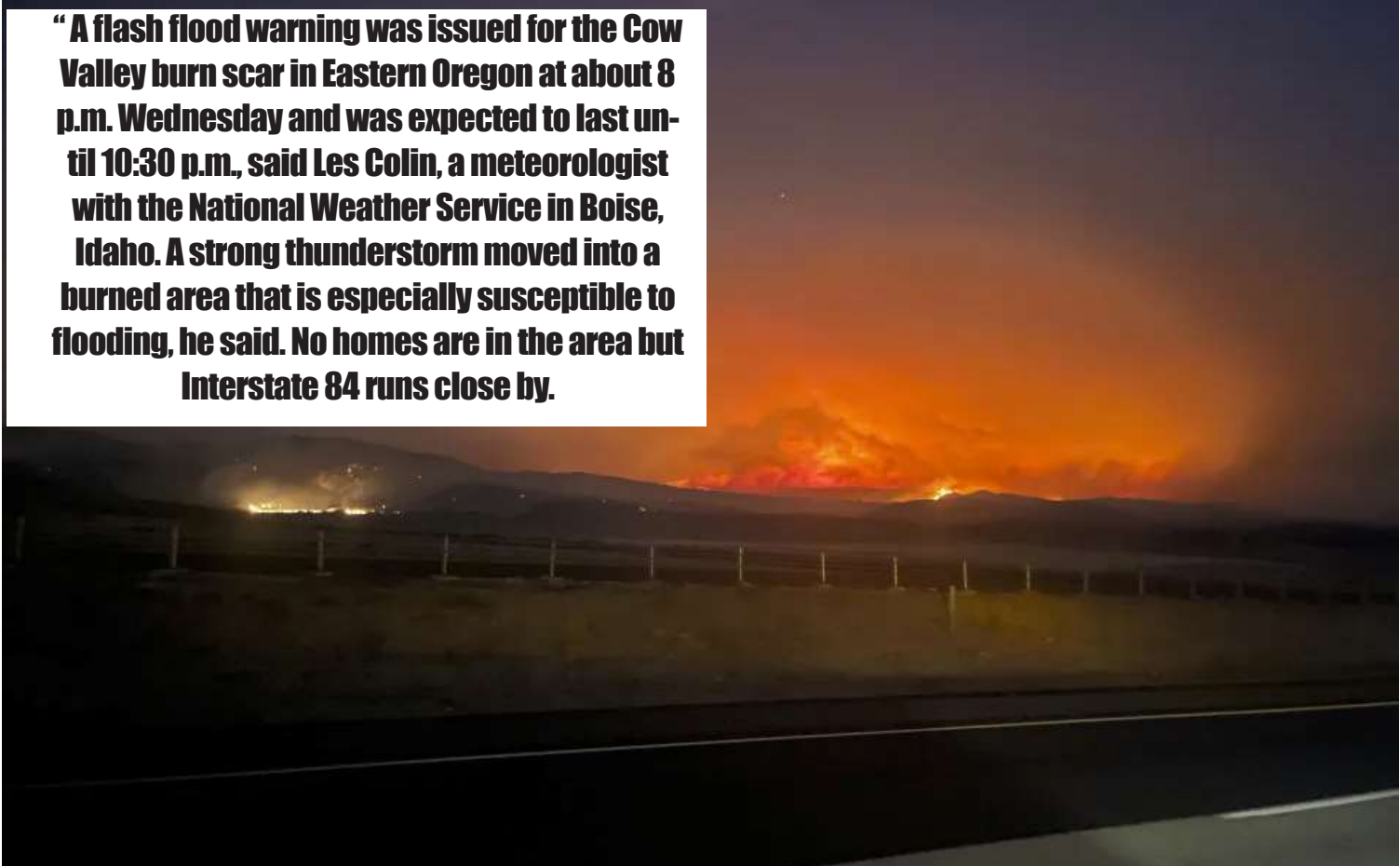
Temperature, rain, snow, fog and wind are all part of weather. Severe weather events such as tornadoes, tropical storms, hurricanes, cyclones, floods, lightning strikes and extreme weather affect us all. In addition to weather forecasts are ozone levels, changing climate conditions and solar winds. Weather warnings are important forecasts because they are used to protect life and property. People use weather forecasts to determine what to wear on a given day or to plan travel or events. Since outdoor activities are severely curtailed by heavy rain, snow and the wind chill, forecasts can be used to plan activities around these events, and to plan ahead and survive them.

Oregon fire is the largest burning in the US.

“A flash flood warning was issued for the Cow Valley burn scar in Eastern Oregon at about 8 p.m. Wednesday and was expected to last until 10:30 p.m., said Les Colin, a meteorologist with the National Weather Service in Boise, Idaho. A strong thunderstorm moved into a burned area that is especially susceptible to flooding, he said. No homes are in the area but Interstate 84 runs close by.



Powerful winds and hundreds of lightning strikes from thunderstorms rattled eastern Oregon and Idaho Wednesday afternoon, cutting power and stoking fires, including one in Oregon that is already the largest active blaze in the nation. The Durkee Fire, burning near the Oregon-Idaho border about 130 miles (209 kilometers) west of Boise, Idaho, caused the closure of a stretch of Interstate 84 again Wednesday. Amid rapidly forming storms in the afternoon, the blaze crossed the interstate near the town of Huntington, home to about 500 people. It also merged with the Cow Valley Fire, another large blaze that had been burning nearby, Gov. Tina Kotek said. "The wildfires in Eastern Oregon have scaled up quickly," Kotek said in a news release Wednesday evening, calling it a dynamic situation. "We are facing strong erratic winds over the region that could impact all fires. Rain is not getting through. Some communities do not have power." She said she had deployed the National Guard to the region. The nearly 420-square-mile

(1,088-square-kilometer) blaze had prompted the evacuation of Huntington on Sunday, and on Wednesday city officials posted on Facebook that people remaining in town, especially those with "major health issues," needed to leave their homes because of wildfire smoke and the lack of power. City officials also said Wednesday that gas service to residents had been shut off until the evacuation orders are lifted. The fire approached Alison Oszman's home in Rye Valley, a small ranching area north of Huntington, last week, but they were able to protect their property with the help of Bureau of Land Management firefighters and neighbors, using small tanker trucks and shovels. They used a small dozer to keep it away from the house, she said. Since their property was burned and safe, her neighbor moved his horses and cattle over as the fire moved toward his ranch, she said. On Wednesday night, Oszman went to check his property and found that the fire came down a steep hillside and threatened his home. "I went and parked our truck out in the field just in case those big trees by his house caught fire," she said. "I was

making sure sparks didn't land in the dirt or the dry grass. But as the fire passed his house, it started raining." The rain helped the firefighters get on top of the blaze. "It was pretty scary but everything seemed to fall into place," she said. "Everybody helped everybody. It was actually pretty amazing for how crummy it really was." The National Weather Service in Boise said the storms were capable of producing wind gusts up to 70 mph with blowing dust reducing visibility. A storm about 44 miles (71 kilometers) northwest of Huntington near Baker City on Wednesday afternoon had recorded a wind gust of 66 mph (106 kph), the weather service said. Wind, lightning and heavy rain fell that could cause flash flooding and debris flows in recently burned areas, authorities said. Flash flood warnings were issued for Huntington and in a nearby burn scar area. Shared from AP





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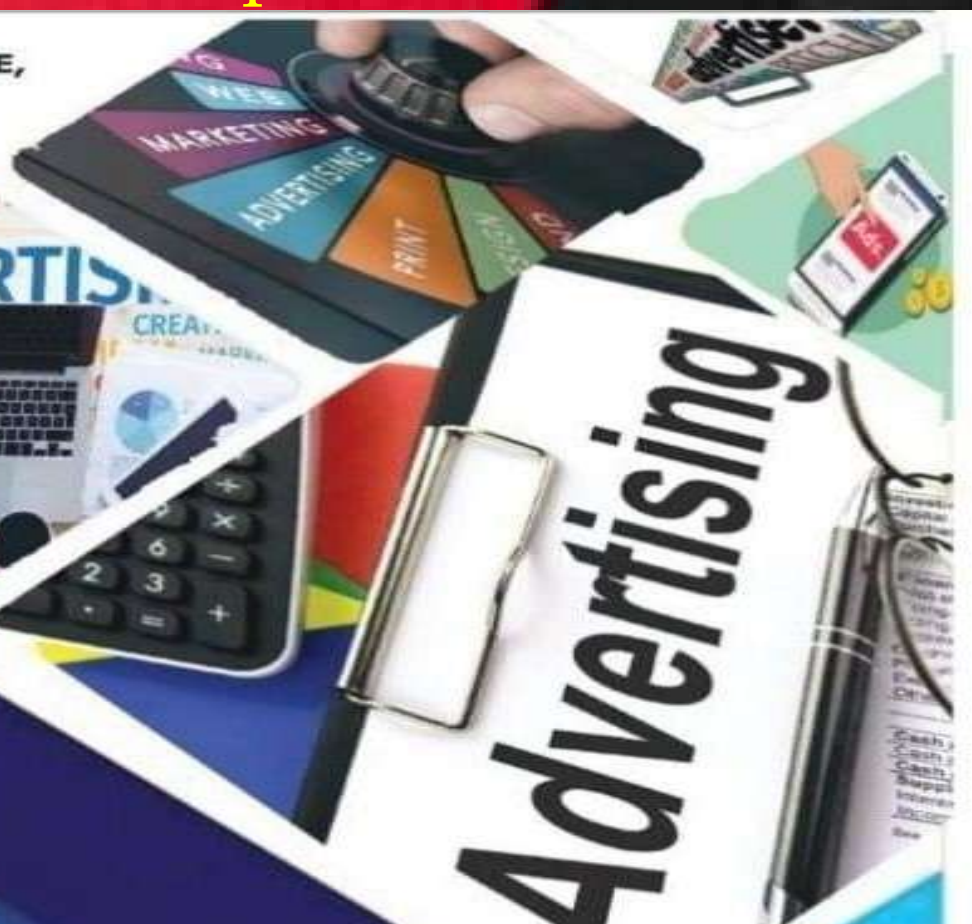
