ield-Marshal Muthoni wa Kirima (1931 September 2023) was a female fighter in Mau Mau's 1950s rebellion against British colonialism. Few Mau Mau women became active fighters, and Muthoni was the only woman to have attained the Mau Mau rank of field-marshal.

Early life

Muthoni Kirima was born in Nairutia village, Nyeri County, Kenya, in 1931 She was born Muthoni Whihuini, originating from her grandfather's name. When Muthoni was very little, her family moved to Karing'u for a better life. The journey was mentioned by her as long and hard for her as a young girl. They traveled 15km, half on a small donkey with no saddle, and the other half she walked herself. During her time in Karing'u, Muthoni first learned about Christianity and became infatuated with it. As a child, she went into the

missionaries' tent with other children to learn about Christianity. By the time she was eight years old, she started her long-standing devotion to the church. Her experience of racial violence between Kenyan settlers and the Kikuyu came when she was doing child labor at the farm of a white settler.

During this period of her life, she saw verbal and emotional abuse, physical violence toward Kikuyu men, and sexual violence toward Kikuyu women. This is said[by whom?] to have drove her resolve to fight for independence to free her people and her country.

In 1948, she met her husband Mutungi Gichuhi, who was a young cook working at the same settler farm as she did. After their wedding, the couple moved to the edge of Nyeri town and started their own life;

Muthoni became a trader and her husband became a cook.

Muthoni Kirima first took the Mau Mau oath in 1952. From then on, she had to balance being part of the revolution with family responsibilities. She started out by using her connections as a trader to get information and events that were happening to the Mau Mau that were in the forest.

She also organized the oaths of other people. This was extremely hard on her because at this time her husband didn't take the oath and she felt guilty lying to him. This changed in 1953 when her husband Mutungi Gichuhi finally decided that he wanted to take the oath and join the Mau Mau. That same

day, Muthoni Kirima took Mau fighters. To get the inhim and a goat to her father in law's home in the Kinaini they beat her relentlessly. In forest where he swore his oath to the Mau Mau fighters. That was the last time that she would see her husband for 11 years, as he lived in the forest until 1963.

The next day, Chief Muhoya, who was an African colonial chief in Kenya, sent soldiers to Muthoni Kirima's house to check on her husband, as he was a candidate to be a member of the Kamatimu, a loyalist group under Chief Muhoya.

When they questioned her, she told them that he went to get eggs and had not returned, so they eventually left. Three days later, they came back with the suspicion that he joined the Mau

formation that they needed, an interview, she describes this by saying, "I was beaten

They kicked me with their boots until I could hardly move. Blood oozed from my nostrils. They left me unconscious." She credits this moment as the turning point that made her want to not just be in the village helping the Mau Mau fighters but to be a forest fighter. This was when she took off to the forest and after a week by herself, she found the Mau Mau fighters.

Kirima started her time in the forest as a non-combatant; like most of the other women, she just cooked and looked after the soldiers while getting them ammunition and grenades from the market.

But she quickly impressed her fellow soldiers with her shooting skills and quick thinking. Before long, she was leading her own platoons and helped break the gender norms of the Mau Mau fighters.

In an interview in 2015, a woman veteran soldier says, "There was one woman called Muthoni, I was with her. She feared nothing. She used to go to war with men because she did not fear. She was a dangerous woman; even men feared her."

Tom Girardi found guilty of wire fraud: 'It wasn't a hard decision,' juror says

A federal court jury in
Los Angeles found Tom
Girardi, once a legal titan
and now a disgraced
former attorney, guilty
Tuesday of wire fraud
for leading a years long
scheme in which he embezzled tens of
millions of dollars.

The verdict concluded a 13-day trial in which prosecutors elicited emotional testimony from former clients, including a burn victim and a widow whose husband died in a boating accident, employees of the now-closed law firm Girardi Keese and an outside attorney who struggled to get a woman the settlement money she'd been granted.

As clients went unpaid, prosecutors told the jury, Girardi spent money on private jets, country clubs and the entertainment career of his now-estranged wife, Erika Girardi, a star of "Real Housewives of Beverly Hills."

Girardi, 85, had been on trial on four counts of wire fraud; he was found guilty on all four

The jury deliberated for roughly four hours before delivering a verdict. Girardi, in the same gray blazer he'd worn throughout the trial, swiveled back and forth in his chair as he waited to hear his fate.

He turned to watch Judge Josephine Staton as she read the verdict, face impassive. As she recited the final guilty verdict, he rubbed his forehead. He could be sentenced to up to 80 years in prison.

2 people killed, 1 injured in reported tire explosion at Delta facility in Atlanta's Hartsfield-Jackson airport.

wo people were killed and one was injured after a tire reportedly exploded at a Delta Air Lines facility adjacent to Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport on Tuesday morning, officials said.

Georgia's Clayton County Medical Examiner's Office identified the dead Tuesday evening as Mirko F. Marweg, 58, of Stone Mountain, Georgia; and Luis Aldarondo, 37, of Newnan, Georgia. In response to an inquiry about the workers' length of employment, titles and job duties, Delta spokesperson Anthony L. Black said, "We are not releasing any details on our Delta employees at this time."

In an earlier statement, the airline confirmed the deaths and injury of members of their staff.

"The Delta family is heartbroken at the loss of two team members and the injury of another following an incident this morning at the Atlanta Technical Operations Maintenance facility (TOC 3)," the statement said. "We have extended our full support to family members and colleagues during this incredibly difficult time."

A Delta Air Lines spokesperson



said there was an incident in Delta's TechOps facility in Atlanta involving "a wheel component" just after 5 a.m. The TechOps division is North America's largest provider of maintenance, repair and aircraft overhauling, according to Delta's website.

Delta said it is conducting an investigation into the incident and working with local authorities. Delta did not specify what kind of incident led to the deaths and injury, but a union representing workers at the airport

cited reports of a tire explosion.

The International Association of
Machinists and Aerospace Workers,
a union that represents airlines industry workers across North America, issued a statement on the reported tire explosion and extended
condolences to the victims' families.

Anderson (February 27, 1897) - April 8, 1993) was an American contralto. She performed a wide range of music, from opera to

spirituals. Anderson performed with renowned orchestras in major concert and recital venues throughout the United States and Europe between 1925 and 1965.

Anderson was an important figure in the struggle for African American artists to overcome racial prejudice in the United States during the mid-twentieth century. In 1939, during the period of racial segregation, the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) refused to allow Anderson to sing to an integrated audience in Constitution Hall in Washington, D.C.

The incident placed Anderson in the spotlight of the international community on a level unusual for a classical musician. With the aid of First Lady Eleanor Roosevelt and her husband, President Franklin D. Roosevelt, Anderson performed a critically acclaimed open-air concert on Easter Sunday, April 9, 1939, on the Lincoln Memorial steps in the capital. The event was featured in a documentary film, Marian Anderson: The Lincoln Memorial Concert. She sang before an integrated crowd of more than 75,000 people and a radio audience in the millions.

On January 7, 1955, Anderson became the first African American singer to perform at the Metropolitan Opera. In addition, she worked as a delegate to the United Nations Human Rights Committee and as a Goodwill Ambassador for the United States Department of State, giving concerts all over the world. She participated in the civil rights movement in the 1960s, singing at the March on Washington for Jobs and Freedom in 1963.

The recipient of numerous awards and honors, Anderson was awarded the first Presidential Medal of Freedom in 1963, the Congressional Gold Medal in 1977, the Kennedy Center Honors in 1978, the National Medal of Arts in 1986, and a Grammy Lifetime Achievement Award in 1991.

Marian Anderson was born in Philadelphia on February 27, 1897, to John Berkley Anderson and Annie Delilah Rucker.

Her father sold ice and coal at the Reading Terminal in downtown Philadelphia and eventually also sold liquor. Before her marriage, Anderson's mother was briefly a student at the Virginia Seminary and College in Lynchburg, and worked as a sc-

tain a degree, Annie Anderson was unable to teach in Philadelphia under a law that was applied only to black teachers and not white ones. She therefore earned an income caring for small children. Marian was the eldest of the three Anderson children. Her two sisters, Alyse (1899-1965) and Ethel (1902–90), also became singers. Ethel married James DePreist and their son James Anderson DePreist was a noted conductor.

Anderson's parents were both devout Christians and the whole family was active in the Union Baptist Church, which, during her youth, stood in a building constructed by the congregation in 1889 at 709 S. 12th Street in South Philadelphia.

As she got into her early teens, Marian began to make as much as four or five dollars for singing, a considerable sum for the early 20th century. > When Anderson was 12, her father received a head injury while working at the Reading Terminal before Christmas 1909. Soon afterwards, her father died following heart failure. He was 37 years old. Marian and her family moved into the home of her father's parents, Benjamin and Isabella Anderson.

> Her grandfather had been born a slave and was emancipated in the 1860s. He relocated to South Philadelphia, the first person in his family to do so. When Anderson moved into his home, the two became very close, but he died just a year after the family moved there.

Benjamin Banneker

Banneker's knowledge of astronomy helped him author a commercially successful series of almanacs. He corresponded with Thomas Jefferson on the topics of slavery and racial equality.

enjamin Banneker was African-American naturalist, mathematician, astronomer and almanac author. A landowner, he also worked as a surveyor and farmer.

Born in Baltimore County, Maryland, to a free African-American mother and a father who had formerly been enslaved, Banneker had little or no formal education and was largely self-taught. He became known for assisting Major Andrew Ellicott in a survey that established the original borders of the District of Columbia, the federal capital district of the United States.

Banneker's knowledge of astronomy helped him author a commercially successful series of almanacs. He corresponded with Thomas Jefferson on the topics of slavery and racial equality. Abolitionists and advocates of racial equality promoted and praised Banneker's works. Although a fire on the day of Banneker's funeral destroyed many of his papers and belongings, one of his journals and several of his remaining artifacts survived.

Banneker became a folk-hero after his death, leading to many accounts of his life being exaggerated or embellished.[2] The names of parks, schools and streets commemorate him and his works, as do other tributes.


Early life

Banneker was born on November 9, 1731, in Baltimore County, Maryland, to Mary Banneky, a free black woman, and Robert, a freed slave from Guinea who died in 1759. There are two conflicting accounts of Banneker's family history.

Banneker himself and his earliest biographers described him as having only African ancestry.[5][6][7] None of Banneker's surviving papers describe a white ancestor or identify the name of his grandmother.

However, later biographers have contended that Banneker's mother was the child of Molly Welsh, a former white indentured servant, and an African slave named Banneka. [4][6][8] The first published description of Molly Welsh was based on interviews with her descendants that took place in 1836, long after the deaths of both Molly and Benjamin. [6][9] According to that story, Molly purchased Banneka to help establish a farm located near the future site of Ellicott's Mills, Maryland, west of Baltimore.

A biographer suggested in 2002 that Banneka may have been a member of the Dogon people, who several anthropologists have claimed had an early knowledge of astronomy (see Dogon astronomical beliefs).

Molly supposedly freed and married Banneka, who may have shared his knowledge of astronomy with her. The biographer suggested that Benjamin acquired this knowledge from Molly, as Benjamin was born after Banneka's death.

A genealogist who in 2016 reported an analysis of records related to Banneker's family tree was unable to identify any documents that showed that Banneker had a white grandmother, but could not rule out that possibility. The report noted that the name "Bannaker" may have had the same origin as that of Banaka, a small village in the present-day Klay District of Bomi County in northwestern Liberia that had once participated in the African slave trade. A 2021 update to this genealogy stated that Benjamin Banneker's father Robert

A 2021 update to this genealogy stated that Benjamin Banneker's father, Robert, was by May 18, 1731, married to Mary Lett (then called Mary Beneca), the daughter of a white woman by an enslaved man. The update noted that Banaka is the home of the Vai people, who have lived there since about 1500 when they left the Mali Empire. In 1737, Banneker was named at the age of 6 on the deed of his family's 100-acre (0.40 km2) farm in the Patapsco Valley in rural Baltimore County.

A letter writer stated in 1791 that Banneker's parents had sent him to an obscure

school where he learned reading, writing and arithmetic as far as double position. [clarification needed However, the remainder of Banneker's early life is not well documented

Unverified accounts that first appeared in books published more than 140 years after Banneker's death relate that, as a young teenager, Banneker met and befriended Peter Heinrich, a Quaker who later established a school near the Banneker family farm. (Quakers were leaders in the anti-slavery movement and advocates of racial equality (see Quakers in the abolition movement and Testimony of equality)). These accounts state that Heinrich shared his personal library and provided Banneker with his only classroom instruction. Banneker's formal education (if any) presumably ended when he was old enough to help on his family's farm.



Around 1753, at about the age of 21, Banneker reportedly completed a wooden clock that struck on the hour. He appears to have modelled his clock from a borrowed pocket watch by carving each piece to scale. The clock continued to work until his death.

County petition to move the

Airlines would no longer be allowed to charge parents extra fees for their kids to be seated next to them under a new rule proposed by the Biden administration. White House officials say their "fee-free family seating" proposal could potentially save parents up to \$200 per round trip flight.

"Families don't need any additional stresses or costs when flying on top of how demanding it can be to be a parent flying with your kids," Transportation Secretary Pete Buttigieg told reporters when announcing the proposed rule.

Buttigieg said, "The idea that parents ought to be seated next to their own children on a flight is common sense and also seems like something that ought to be standard practice."

Documents show her family hired Jonathan Gracia, 19, her acquaintance, to photograph her 21st birthday party on Aug. 17. He drank too much that night, puking, and he crashed in her bed.

Shortly afterward, she went to sleep on the other side. Around 5:30 a.m., she said he pinned her down by her shoulders. She was "scared" and froze, before he raped her.



The next day, Hammond cops found him bloodied elsewhere around the 1200 block of 175th Street after the victim's brother beat him up and her mom beat Gracia with a pipe. The brother said he had tried to stop his mom. Gracia's face and arms were bleeding "excessively," police wrote.

Earlier at the house, the victim ran and told her brother when Gracia fell back asleep. He told Gracia to leave, who mistakenly took a black backpack from her

room on the way out.

At the house, he denied raping the woman to her mother and brother, before they attacked him, then took it outside, charges state.



Killer with Nazi face tattoos sentenced to death for murder of two women after emotional plea from his parents

killer with
Nazi face

death on Tuesday.

Wade Wilson, 30, appeared motionless in the courtroom in Lee County, Florida as the sentence was read as cheers and claps erupted from people in the gallery. Wilson had declined to address the court earlier in the afternoon.

In June, Wilson was convicted of two counts of first-degree felony murder and two counts of first-degree premeditated murder in the deaths of Kristine Melton, 35, and Diane Ruiz, 43. He strangled the women within hours of each other on October 6, 2019 in Cape Coral.

The jury voted in favor of the death penalty 9-3 in Melton's case, and 10-2 in Ruiz's murder. In Florida, only eight out of 12 jurors need to recommend the death penalty for it to be considered by a judge.

The jury also needed to prove the crimes involved aggravating factors. In this case, the panel found the crimes were heinous, atrocious, or cruel; committed by a person convicted of another felony and who had previously been convicted of a felony while in prison.

During a motion hearing on Tuesday morning, Wilson's attorney, Lee Hollander, requested the court impose two life sentences instead of the death penalty.

Hollander asked County Circuit Judge Nicholas R Thompson to consider whether his client had the capacity to appreciate the criminal nature of the conduct or was substantially impaired when the crimes occurred.

"We'd ask the court to take into consideration that death is permanent," Hollander said, a sentiment Assistant State Attorney Andreas Gardiner agreed with.

"Mr Wilson's decisions were not only pitiless and consciousness less, but they amounted to tragically reducing Ms Melton, as well as Ms Ruiz, to nothing more than memories and photographs," Gardiner said, during the motion hearing.

Prosecutors said Wilson met Melton at a live music bar before strangling her to death at her home in Cape Coral, where her body was discovered.

Wilson left the residence and found Ruiz walking along a Cape Coral street. He approached her in a car that he had stolen from Melton's home. Wilson asked Ruiz for directions and she got into the car. When the woman tried to get out of the vehicle, Wilson strangled her and "ran her over until she looked like spaghetti," the court heard. The two women were not known to each other

Throughout the trial, the jury heard evidence of the



numerous injuries suffered by the women. Melton suffered bruising to her face and body, hemorrhages on her neck and contusions to the lungs, liver, bladder and colon, among others. Some of the injuries Ruiz suffered included a nasal bone fracture, a laceration to her left breast, bruising on both sides of her body and multiple rib fractures.

Judge Thompson had the final say on whether the defendant was sentenced to death or life in prison without parole. To impose a death sentence, he had to consider each aggravating factor found by the jury and

all mitigating circumstances.

"Given the facts of the case, nothing in defendant's background or mental state would suggest that a death sentence is inappropriate," Thompson said before sentencing Wilson to death.

Prior to the sentencing hearing, three women sent Judge Thompson letters pleading with him to spare Wilson's life. They cited the killer's history of mental health issues, substance abuse and alleged lack of parental support.

"With regards to the Wade Wilson case, it appears clearly documented that Mr

Wilson suffers with mental health issues that appear to be severely aggravated by the use of drugs," Lindsay Brann, a mother of two boys in Alberta, Canada, wrote in a letter, Lee County Circuit Court records show. Yahoonews share



Severe weather events such as tornadoes, tropical storms, hurricanes, cyclones, floods, lightning strikes and extreme weather affect us all. In addition to weather forecasts are ozone levels, changing climate conditions and solar winds. Weather warnings are important forecasts because they are used to protect life and property. People use weather forecasts to determine what to wear on a given day or to plan travel or events. Since outdoor activities are severely curtailed by heavy rain, snow and the wind chill, forecasts can be used to plan activities around these events, and to plan ahead and survive them.

A new line of storms was barreling through Texas on Sunday as officials worked to assess damage from a series of tornadoes and severe weather which left at least 11 people dead overnight.

Authorities said the full extent of the damage from Saturday's spate of storms was not yet known — but warned the region should get ready for another hit. Forecasters warned of more "severe" weather and heavy rain.

The same storm system that spawned the deadly twisters in the Dallas area was expected to leave up to 16 inches of snow in west Texas through Sunday evening, according to the **National Weather Service (NWS).**

Slow down! Michigan mom's texts to son may come back to haunt her

Rather, she bought a faster and more powerful car, and allegedly gave him access to it: a BMW X3 M series that can reach up to 177 mph

ust weeks before he killed his friend in a car crash, Michigan teenager Kiernan Tague was blasting across highways

more than 140 mph in his family's Audi sports coupe, photographing the speedometer and getting texts from his mom: "Slow... down!"

According to police reports, his mom knew about his driving habits through a special safety app called Life360, and once texted him: "I have screen shots of you ... doing 123 mph ... It scares me to my bone."

But she didn't take away his

Rather, she bought a faster and more powerful car, and allegedly gave him access to it: a BMW X3 M series that can reach up to 177 mph. That's what Kiernan was driving the night he lost control at 105 mph on a residential street in Grosse Pointe Farms, a Detroit suburb, hitting a pole and then a tree, killing his passenger: 18-year-old Flynn MacKrell, a stellar, 6-foot-4 swimmer known for his gentle ways, easy smile and shaggy red hair. "To say this is a living hell is an understatement," Flynn's mom, Anne Vanker, said through tears in a recent interview with the Detroit Free Press, part of the USA TODAY Network. "My life has been ruined. My family's life is ruined. No one should ever, ever have to lose a child like this ... I still can't believe my son — my big calm son — is gone."

Nine months after Flynn's tragic death, his family is seeking justice: Not just for the driver's actions, but for his mom's inaction.

MacKrell's family is asking



Kym Worthy to pursue criminal charges against the driver's mom, Elizabeth Puleo-Tague — much like another Michigan prosecutor, Oakland County's Karen McDonald, sought parental accountability after the deadly mass shooting at Oxford High School in 2021. She charged the gunman's parents, James and Jennifer Crumbley, who were convicted of involuntary manslaughter this year in a landmark prosecution that put parents everywhere on no-

The Crumbleys, who bought the gun that their son, Ethan, used in his rampage, are serving 10-year prison sentences after separate juries held them responsible for the lives of four students — 16-year-old Tate Myre; 17-year-olds Madisyn Baldwin and Justin Shilling, and 14-year-old Hana St. Juliana — killed by their son. Ethan Crumbley also injured six students and a teacher.

The MacKrell family is hoping for a similar result.

"We believe there is cause to bring criminal charges against Mrs. Elizabeth Tague," the family writes in a letter delivered in July to Prosecutor Worthy.

"The (police) report and the investigation clearly illustrate that not only were Mr. Tague's driving habits criminal — frequently filming himself speeding at more than 100 mph on our local Detroit roads — but that (his mom) was intimately aware of his behavior, but did not take the actions of a 'reasonable' person to prevent

The letter reads much like the legal arguments against the Crumbleys, who were accused of failing to take reasonable actions to prevent their child from harming others: Like not putting a cable lock on the gun he sneaked out of the house and used to shoot up his school, or not bringing him home from school when he drew a picture of a gun in class and wrote "The Thoughts won't stop. Help me" on a school worksheet. Instead, the Crumbleys returned to their jobs. Two hours later, their son fired his first shot.

FBI says gunman spent months seeking a target, then settled on Trump



The gunman who tried to kill Donald Trump mounted a "sustained, detailed effort" to attack a major gathering of some sort before deciding to target the Republican presidential candidate at a Pennsylvania rally in July, FBI officials said on Wednesday. FBI officials said Thomas Crooks, 20, searched more than 60 times for information about the Republican presidential candidate and his then-rival, Democratic President Joe Biden, before registering for the Trump rally in early July. "We saw ... a sustained,

detailed effort to plan an attack on some events, meaning he looked at any number of events or targets," Kevin Rojek, the FBI's top official in western Pennsylvania, said in a telephone briefing to re-

Rojek said Crooks became "hyper focused" on the Trump rally when it was announced in early July "and looked at it as a target of opportunity."

Rojek said the FBI has not yet been able to determine what motivated Crooks to

try to assassinate Trump at a rally in Butler, Pennsylvania, on July 13.

Crooks' computer activity showed he was interested in a mix of ideologies, but did not show definitively that he was motivated by a particular left-leaning or right-leaning point of view, Rojek said.

FBI officials said they had not found any evidence indicated that Crooks had worked with other people, or had been directed by a foreign power.

There were no traces of illicit drugs or alcohol in his system.

The assassination attempt prompted questions about how Crooks was able to climb a nearby building and fire eight shots at the former president before being killed by a Secret Service sharpshooter. Several congressional and government probes are examining the event's security measures.


