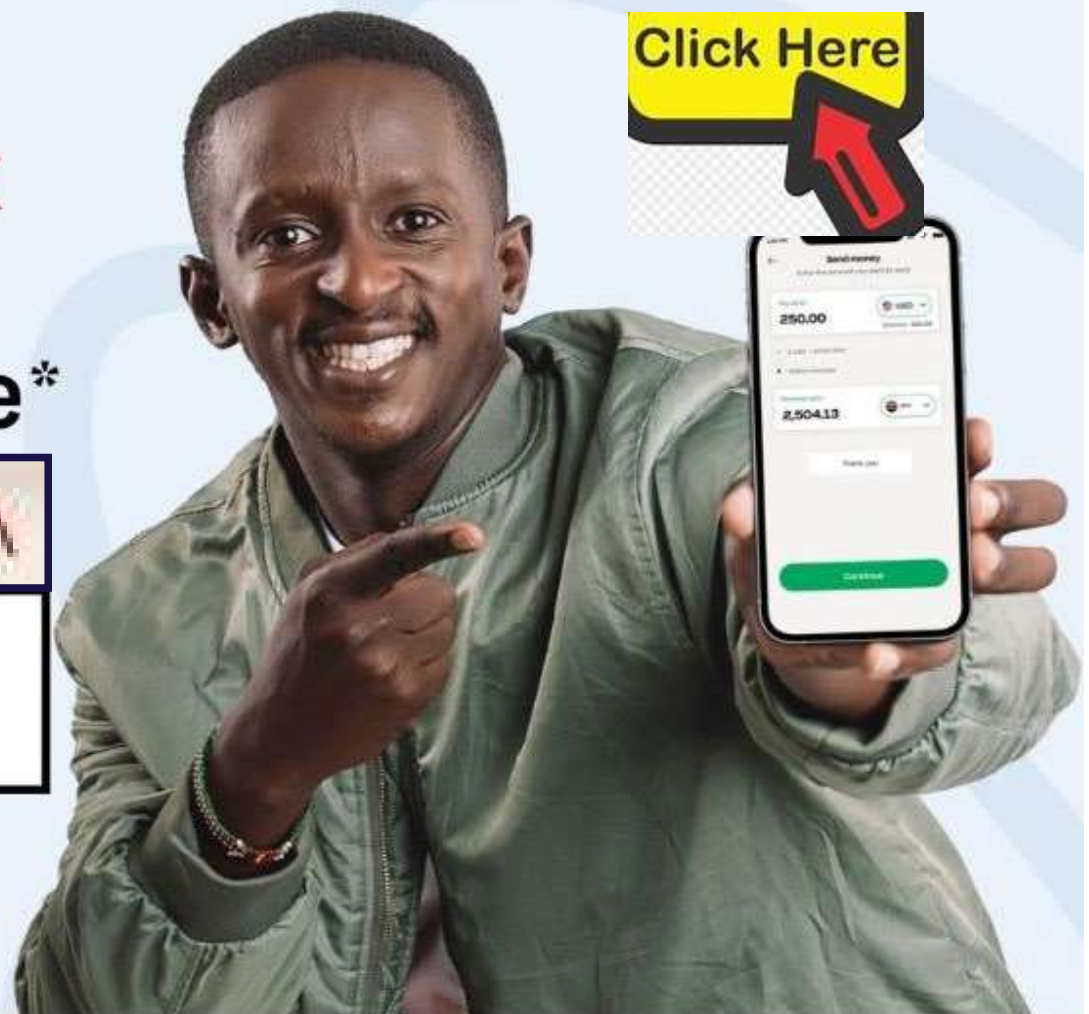

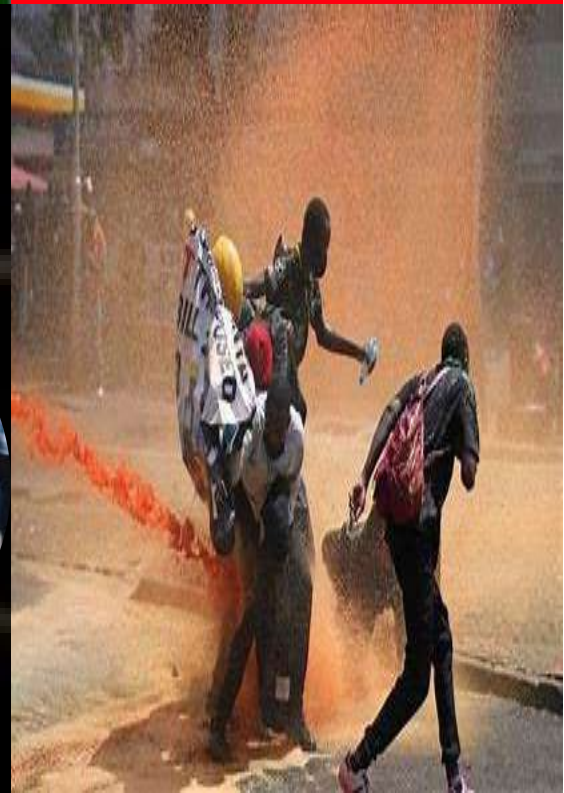

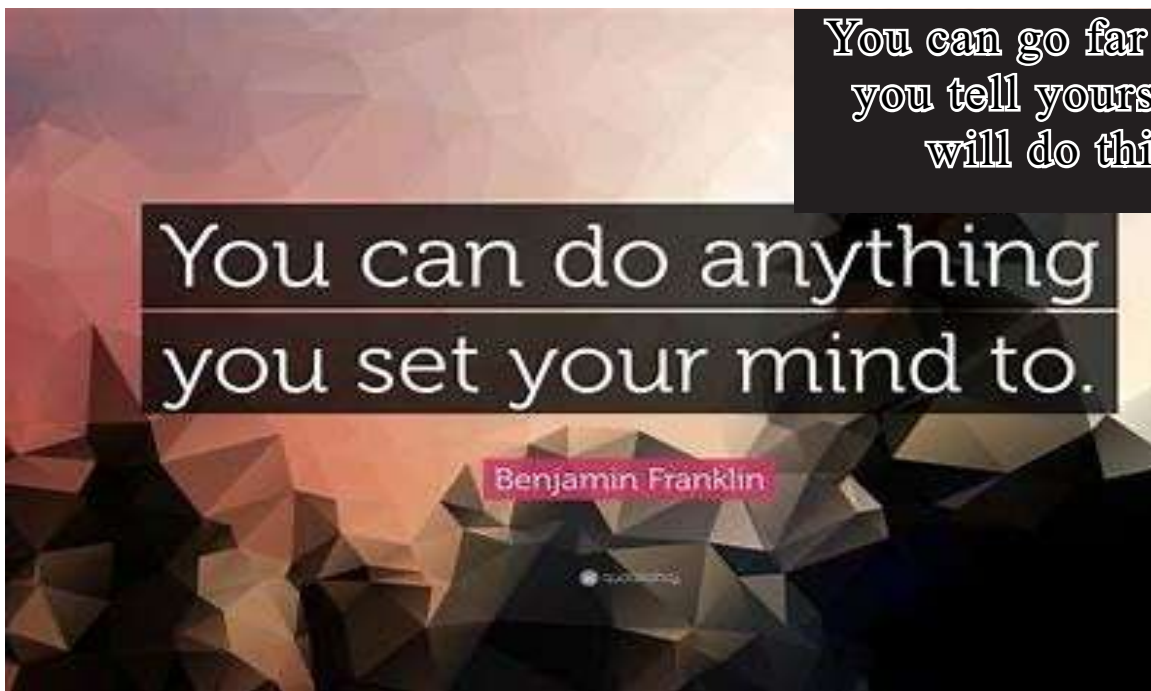

And most importantly, let's work on improving our lives so that the quality is satisfactory. In respect,

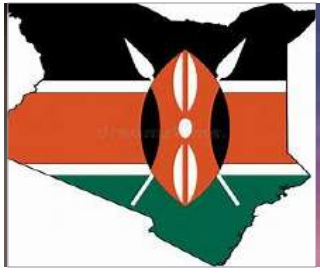
all this is possible when you build a relationship with God.

George Anyona

Anyona was released from detention in 1984 but his attempts to resume active politics were thwarted by the state when he was barred from contesting KANU branch elections in 1985, trade union elections in 1986, the Kitutu East (Masaba) parliamentary seat in the 1988 General Elections and Speaker of the National Assembly in 1988.

George Moseti Anyona (1945–2003) was a politician from Kenya.

Despite being born to peasant parents,

Anyona rose to prominence in the Kenyan political landscape to be thrice elected to the Kenyan Parliament representing the people of Kitutu East (later renamed Kitutu Masaba) constituency.

He shared an ideological viewpoint and was a close political confidant of the first vice-president of Kenya, Jaramogi Oginga Odinga. Anyona's name remains dominant among Kenya's political personalities because he is perceived by a large section of Kenyans as a brave man, who was strong enough to challenge the Kenya African National Union (KANU) government at a time when it was almost suicidal to do so.

He forged a reputation as a principled politician who championed free expression of thought, democracy and a just and equal society. He lived a modest life, never seeking to enrich himself from the offices he held and abhorred the culture of corruption and worship of money that prevailed in the country.

Early life

Anyona was born in 1945 in Tombe Village, Kitutu Masaba, Kenya.

He attended Tombe Primary School from 1952 to 1954 and Sengera Intermediate School from 1955 to 1958 before proceeding to the prestigious Alliance High School where he schooled from 1959 to 1964 and served as Deputy School Captain. From Alliance, he proceeded to Makerere University, Uganda where he studied Political Science, English, Economics and History between 1965 and 1968, graduating with Bachelor of Arts (Hons) and serving as President of the Kenya Makerere Students Union in 1967.

Upon returning from Ugan-

da, Anyona worked as an Assistant Secretary in the Office of the President between 1968 and 1970, as the Secretary General of the Kenya Red Cross Society in 1970 and as Nairobi Airport Manager then District Sales Manager for British Overseas Airways Corporation (BOAC) later renamed British Airways in Nairobi from 1970 to 1974.

In 1974, he contested and won the then Kitutu East Parliamentary seat. He quickly established a reputation as a fearless firebrand and for thorough research before presenting issues in parliament, coming to be referred to as a 'one-man backbench' after parliament was neutered following the murder of JM Karuiki and the detention of then Deputy Speaker and Tinderet MP Jean Marie Seroney and

Butere MP Martin Shikuku.

Anyona's political troubles began in 1977 when he was arrested within the precincts of parliament (an illegality in itself) for questioning the award of a tender for the supply of wagons to the then East African Railways and Harbours Corporation and detained without trial at Manyani Prison by then President Jomo Kenyatta. He was released a year later by President Daniel arap Moi soon after he assumed power following the death of President Kenyatta.

His attempts to resume representative politics were thwarted when he was barred from contesting his old parliamentary seat in the 1979 General Elections and from contesting trade union elections as a candidate for the post of Secre-

tary General of the Transport and Allied Workers Union in 1980.

Anyona would again be arrested in 1981 and charged with sedition but the charges were eventually withdrawn by the state. In 1982, this time with his longtime friend and veteran politician Jaramogi Oginga Odinga and several others, he attempted to form a political party Kenya African Socialist Alliance (KASA) to challenge the ruling party KANU. He was arrested on the way to the Intercontinental Hotel Nairobi to hold a press conference to announce the formation of the party and was detained without trial on 2 June 1982 and incarcerated at Kamiti and Shimo La Tewa Prisons; Jaramogi was later placed under house arrest in August 1982. to be cont....

With the multi-party elections coming up in December 1992, all opposition parties hoped Anyona would give them his endorsement. FORD-Kenya in particular, then under Jaramogi Oginga Odinga was seen as Anyona's perfect destination. He was elected the FORD-Kenya Nyamira District Branch Chairman in absentia. In a surprising move however, Anyona rejected FORD-Kenya's overtures, opting instead to launch his own political party Kenya Social Congress. In the 1992 Multi-Party General Elections, he easily won the Kitutu Masaba Constituency parliamentary seat, becoming the only member of parliament from the KSC. He also stood as a presidential candidate in the same elections and came out 5th. He served as the Chairman of the Public Investments Committee (PIC) of the national assembly for 1993/1994 and was re-elected as a member of parliament in 1997 for another 5-year term. Anyona died on 4 November 2003 in a car crash on Lusaka Road in Nairobi.

Mass. police recruit dies after getting knocked out.



A Massachusetts family is demanding a full investigation after a state police recruit died after being injured during a training exercise late last week at the Massachusetts State Police Academy.

Police said Enrique Delgado-Garcia, 25, of Worcester was injured and became unresponsive during a training exercise Thursday on defensive tactics. He died the next day. The exercise involved boxing, according to WBZ-CBS News Boston.

The boxing component at the Massachusetts State Police Academy was suspended and revamped in the 1990s to respond to injury concerns, a former state police instructor told the Worcester Telegram & Gazette, part of the USA

After giving aid to the recruit, the academy's medical team determined that urgent care was required, and the trainee was transported to UMass Memorial Medical Center in Worcester, state police said.

"Despite the heroic efforts of medical professionals to deliver lifesaving care, Trainee Delgado-Garcia died at the hospital," state police said in a statement Friday evening.

Florida sheriff releases mug shot of 11-year-old.

Police in Florida's Volusia County say they recovered airsoft rifles, pistols and fake ammunition along with knives, swords and other weapons, from a middle school student who threatened to commit a school shooting.

A Florida sheriff released the mug shot and video of an 11-year-old child charged with a felony for allegedly making a written threat of a mass shooting.

The release came just days after the sheriff said he would start releasing the mug shots of students who are arrested for making school shooting threats; two teenagers and the 11-year-old child were taken into custody within the last few days.

"Since parents, you don't want to raise your kids, I'm gonna start raising them," Volusia County Sheriff Mike Chitwood said at a news conference Friday. "Every time we make an arrest, your kids' photo is going to be put out there and if I can do it, I'm gonna perp walk your kid so that everybody can see what your kid's up to."

On Monday, the sheriff's office announced the arrest of the 11-year-old Creekside Middle School student who allegedly threatened to commit a school shooting and had a "written list of people he claimed he would kill," authorities said.

The boy, of Port Orange, is accused of showing off "several weapons" during a video chat with friends and threatening to commit the shooting at Creekside or Silver Sands Middle School, the sheriff's office said in a news release. Detectives were alerted through Fortify Florida, which allows people to make anonymous reports of suspicious activity to law enforcement and school officials.

The sheriff's office released the child's name, mug shot and a video of him being escorted into the jail. NBC News is not naming the child or showing his pic-



ture because he is a minor.

Police in Florida's Volusia County say they recovered airsoft rifles, pistols and fake ammunition along with knives, swords and other weapons, from a middle school student who threatened to commit a school shooting. (Volusia County Sheriff's Office)

In the video, the child is handcuffed behind his back as deputies take him inside the jail. He's then cuffed around his ankles as he's told to wait in a holding cell until deputies can gather some paperwork.

"Do you have any questions?" the deputy asks.

"No, sir," the boy responds.

Authorities searched the child's room and allegedly found a large number of airsoft rifles, pistols and fake ammunition along with knives, swords and other weapons, the news release states. The alleged list of targets was also recovered.

The child told deputies that the threat was a joke, according to the news release.

Sheriff Chitwood said it's no laughing matter.

"Go talk to the families who have lost a loved one in a school shooting. These little knuckleheads think it's funny. Go talk to those parents and see how funny this is. It's not," he said at Friday's news conference.

The sheriff said that upward of 54 tips had recently been reported through Fortify Florida, and investigators and school districts "have been running around the clock to investigate these tips which are all turning out to be false."

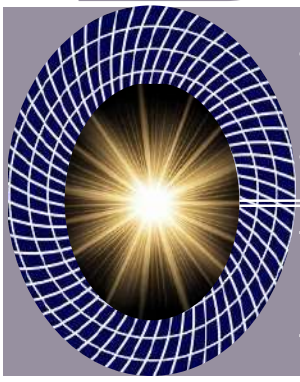

Kamala Harris ignores Hamas in call for cease-fire

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has said a two-state solution and a cease-fire are at odds with the Jewish state's right to defend itself against Hamas, Hezbollah and other proxies of its main enemy, Iran.

Vice President Kamala Harris called again Thursday for an end to Israel's war against Hamas in Gaza — without mentioning the name of the terrorist group that started the conflict and only saying that a cease-fire deal must be "done immediately."

The Democratic nominee also laid out a curious vision for the aftermath of the Middle East conflict during an appearance before the National Association of Black Journalists in Philadelphia.

"That there be no reoccupation of Gaza, that there be no changing of the territorial lines in Gaza, that there be an ability to have security in the region for all concerned in a way that we create stability," she said, without elaborating on who should control the Palestinian enclave in the absence of an Israeli force.

Harris, 59, also stumbled when recounting that "1,200 Israelis" and "some Americans" were "slaughtered" by the jihadist group on Oct. 7, when in fact US officials have said that at least 40 US citizens lost their lives in the atrocity — and included those deaths in the estimation of nearly 1,200 fatalities.

The veep also said that "far too many innocent Palestinians have been killed" in the war and recommitted the US to the long-standing "goal of a two-state solution, because there must be stability and peace in that region ... our goal is to ensure that Israelis have security and Palestinians, in equal measure, have security, have self-dimension and dignity"

Democrats have been bedeviled this election cycle by a vocal minority of Israel critics based in key states like Michigan,

which has the largest Arab population in the US, and which encouraged voters to write "uncommitted" in party primaries earlier this year.

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has said a two-state solution and a cease-fire are at odds with the Jewish state's right to defend itself against Hamas, Hezbollah and other proxies of its main enemy, Iran.

While Harris paid lip service to Israel's right to self-defense, the VP added she was in "support" of a pause the US put

on 2,000-pound bomb shipments to Israel back in May.

"There is some leverage that we have had and used," Harris said of the weapons halt, adding that "we are doing the work of putting the pressure on all parties involved to get the deal done."

Secretary of State Antony Blinken traveled to Egypt on Tuesday to continue pressing for negotiations, but will not be visiting Israel, a possible sign that a deal is not imminent.

The Netanyahu government came under

new pressure to hammer out an agreement to release the remaining hostages last month after six Israeli captives, including American Hersh Goldberg-Polin, were found dead in a Hamas tunnel under the city of Rafah.

Approximately 100 hostages are still believed to be held alive by Hamas.

Romare Bearden

Romare Bearden was an American artist, author, and songwriter. He worked with many types of media including cartoons, oils, and collages.

Born in Charlotte, North Carolina, Bearden grew up in New York City and Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, and graduated from New York University in 1935.

He began his artistic career creating scenes of the American South. Later, he worked to express the humanity he felt was lacking in the world after his experience in the US Army during World War II on the European front. He returned to Paris in 1950 and studied art history and philosophy at the Sorbonne.

Bearden's early work focused on unity and cooperation within the African-American community. After a period during the 1950s when he painted more abstractly, the theme reemerged in his collage works of the 1960s. The New York Times described Bearden as "the nation's foremost collagist" in his 1988 obituary.

Bearden became a founding member of the Harlem-based art group known as Spiral, formed to discuss the responsibility of the African-American artist in the civil rights movement.

Bearden was the author or coauthor of several books. He also was a songwriter, known as co-writer of the jazz classic "Sea Breeze", which was recorded by Billy Eckstine, a former high school classmate at Peabody High School, and Dizzy Gillespie. He had long supported young, emerging artists and he and his wife established the Bearden Foundation to continue this work, as well as to support young scholars. In 1987, Bearden was awarded the National Medal of Arts.

Early life and education

Bearden was born September 2, 1911, in Charlotte. Bearden and his family moved to New York City when he was a toddler, as part of the Great Migration. After enrolling in P.S. 5 in 1917, on 141 Street and Edgecombe Avenue in Harlem, he attended P.S. 139 and then DeWitt Clinton High School. In 1927 he moved to East Liberty, Pittsburgh[5] with his grandparents and then returned to New York City. The Bearden household soon became a meeting place for major figures of the Harlem Renaissance. His father, Howard Bearden, was a pianist. Romare's mother, Bessye Bearden, played an active role with the



(September 2, 1911 – March 12, 1988)

New York City Board of Education, and also was the founder and president of the Colored Women's Democratic League. She was a New York correspondent for The Chicago Defender, an African-American newspaper.

Romare had Cherokee, Italian, and African ancestry. The Washington Post described him as "African American." His fair skin allowed him to cross boundaries which many other Black people were unable to access.

In 1929, Romare Bearden graduated from Peabody High School in Pittsburgh. He enrolled in Lincoln University, the nation's second oldest historically Black college, founded in 1854. He transferred to Boston University where he served as the art director for Beanpot, Boston University's student humor magazine. He continued his studies at New York University (NYU), where he started to focus more on his art and less on athletics, and became a lead cartoonist and art

editor for The Medley, the monthly journal of the secretive Eucleian Society at NYU. Bearden studied art, education, science, and mathematics graduating with a degree in science and education in 1935.

Bearden continued his artistic study under German artist George Grosz at the Art Students League in 1936 and 1937. During this time he supported himself by working as a political cartoonist for African-American newspapers, including the Baltimore Afro-American, where he published a weekly cartoon from 1935 until 1937. During the 1970s, he participated in a community art space called Communications Village operated by printmaker Benjamin Leroy Wigfall in Kingston, NY. Andrews made prints with the help of printer assistants who had been taught printmaking by Wigfall, and he exhibited there.

Personal life and death

In 1954, at age 42, Bearden married Nanette Rohan, a 27-year-old dancer from Staten Island, New York. She later became an artist and critic. The couple eventually created the Bearden Foundation to assist young artists.

Bearden died in New York City on March 12, 1988, due to complications from bone cancer. The New York Times described Bearden in its obituary as "one of America's pre-eminent artists" and "the nation's foremost collagist."

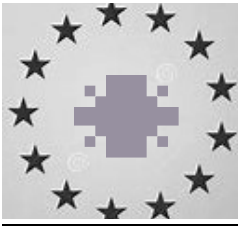

The father of an 11-year-old Ohio boy who was killed last year when a

minivan driven by a Haitian immigrant struck his school bus said Tuesday that Donald Trump and JD Vance were "morally bankrupt politicians" who were using his dead son as a political tool.

Nathan Clark, of Springfield, denounced the Republican presidential ticket and asked Trump and Vance to apologize in an impassioned speech before the City Commission after Vance, the Republican nominee for vice president, mentioned the death of Clark's son Aiden as a reason to oppose Haitian immigration.

is, to say the least, reprehensible for any political purpose," Clark said during the commission's public comment period, according to a livestream of the meeting.

"This needs to stop now," he added. "I will listen to them one more time to hear their apolo-



gies." Asked for comment on Clark's statement, Luke Schroeder, a spokesperson for Vance, said that Vice President Kamala Harris should apologize to people who are victims of crime allegedly committed by immigrants — some of whom have blamed the Biden administration and testified before Congress.

"They hold her and her open borders policies accountable for the deaths of their children," Schroeder said in an email.

"The Clark family is in Senator Vance's prayers," he said.

Campaign representatives for Trump did not immediately respond to requests for comment late Tuesday, as Trump was preparing to debate his Democratic opponent, Harris.

Earlier Tuesday, the Trump-Vance campaign thrust the 11-year-old boy and his family into the nation's political spotlight. Vance alluded to Aiden in a post on X, writing that "a child was murdered by a Haitian migrant." On Monday, an X account used by the Trump campaign posted a tweet about Aiden.

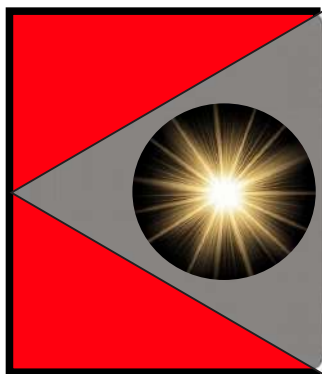

OUR WINGS OF GLORY

Our languages are our wings to glory. Let us root ourselves in them and Africa will fly.

What was my crime? I was trying to show that rooted in our languages and belief in the power of the Kenya working class and the small farmer, ie the Wanjikū of Kenya and Africa, we can break any barriers set against our development. There is no height we cannot reach.

Trying to beak barriers has been the constant theme in my writing career. I was a second year undergraduate student at Makerere when I said I was writing a book. The other students laughed at me, pointing that only a few professors had been able to write a book. And you, a freshman at the University, you say you want to write a book.

I said, I can do it, a student can do it. I entered Makerere in July 1959. By December 1961, I had completed writing my first novel, years later published under the title, The River Between. In 1962, still a student, I wrote Weep Not Child, published in

1964. But I also wrote about 8 short stories. In addition I used to write weekly column for the Sunday Nation, titled, As I See It by James Ngugi.

It was also as a student that I wrote and directed the Play, The Black Hermit, the first English language play by an East African, to be played at the Kampala National Theater, which, until then, was dominated by European theater,

That has been my spirit, and I carried it into my post-graduate studies in Leeds University where I wrote and published my third Novel: A Grain of Wheat. That was the same spirit I carried back to Kenya on my eventual return from Leeds in 1968. There is more to tell about my days in Leeds in my memoir of Leeds under the title: Horseman of the Sixties. And I was punished for it.

Breast cancer is a kind of cancer that begins as a growth of cells in the breast tissue.

After skin cancer, breast cancer is the most common cancer diagnosed in women in the United States. But breast cancer doesn't just happen in women. Everyone is born with some breast tissue, so anyone can get breast cancer.

Breast cancer survival rates have been increasing. And the number of people dying of breast cancer is steadily going down. Much of this is due to the widespread support for breast cancer awareness and funding for research.

Advances in breast cancer screening allow healthcare professionals to diagnose breast cancer earlier. Finding the cancer earlier makes it much more likely that the cancer can be cured. Even when breast cancer can't be cured, many treatments exist to extend life. New discoveries in breast cancer research are helping healthcare professionals choose the most effective treatment plans.

Signs and symptoms of breast cancer may include:

A breast lump or thickened

area of skin that feels different from the surrounding tissue. A nipple that looks flattened or turns inward.

Changes in the color of the breast skin. In people with white skin, the breast skin may look pink or red. In people with brown and Black skin, the breast skin may look darker than the other skin on the chest or it may look red or purple.

Change in the size, shape or appearance of a breast.

Changes to the skin over the breast, such as skin that looks dimpled or looks like an orange peel. Peeling, scaling, crusting or flaking of the skin on the breast.

When to see a doctor
If you find a lump or other

change in your breast, make an appointment with a doctor or other healthcare professional. Don't wait for your next mammogram to see if the change you found is breast cancer. Report any changes in your breasts even if a recent mammogram showed there was no breast cancer.

Causes

The exact cause of most breast cancers isn't known. Researchers have found things that increase the risk of breast cancer. These include hormones, lifestyle choices and things in the environment. But it's not clear why some people who don't have any factors get cancer, yet others with risk factors never do. It's likely that breast cancer happens through a complex interaction of your genetic

makeup and the world around you.

Healthcare professionals know that breast cancer starts when something changes the DNA inside cells in the breast tissue. A cell's DNA holds the instructions that tell a cell what to do. In healthy cells, the DNA gives instructions to grow and multiply at a set rate.

The instructions tell the cells to die at a set time. In cancer cells, the DNA changes give different instructions. The changes tell the cancer cells to make many more cells quickly. Cancer cells can keep living when healthy cells would die. This causes too many cells.

The cancer cells might form a mass called a tumor. The tumor can grow to invade and destroy healthy body tissue. In time, cancer cells can break away and spread to other parts of the body. When cancer spreads, it's called metastatic cancer.

The DNA changes that lead to breast cancer most often happen in the cells that line the milk ducts. These ducts are tubes designed to carry milk to the nipple. Breast cancer that starts in the ducts is called invasive ductal carcinoma. Breast cancer also can start in cells in the milk glands. These glands, called lobules, are designed to make breast milk. Cancer that happens in the lobules is called invasive lobular carcinoma. Other cells in the breast can become cancer cells, though this isn't common. may feel reluctant to seek help.

A family history of breast cancer. If a parent, sibling or child had breast cancer, your risk of breast cancer is increased. The risk is higher if your family has a history of getting breast cancer.....

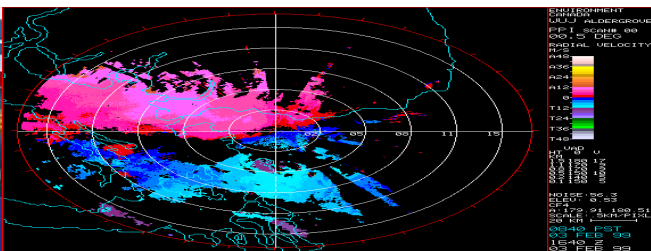

Israel launches strikes on Hezbollah.

The last two days of explosions in Lebanon, triggered remotely with explosives inside pagers or walkie-talkies, have killed at least 37 people and wounded 2,931.

Smoke rises from the southern Lebanese village of Kfar Kila, amid ongoing cross-border hostilities between Hezbollah and Israeli forces.



“Where is the justice for Jayda?”



Israel launched a series of strikes on Hezbollah targets Thursday as the war against the Lebanon-based group widened in the wake of two consecutive days of deadly explosions triggered in wireless devices. “The IDF is currently striking Hezbollah targets in Lebanon to degrade Hezbollah’s terrorist capabilities and infrastructure,” the Israeli army said. “The Hezbollah terrorist organization has turned southern Lebanon into a combat zone. For decades, Hezbollah has weaponized civilian homes, dug tunnels beneath them, and used civilians as human shields.” Two large sonic booms shook buildings in Beirut on Thursday as Hezbollah leader Hassan Nasrallah delivered a speech on this week’s device explosions. The IDF strikes come as Nasrallah said the use of the devices in civilian areas crossed all laws and red lines. “This criminal act is a major terrorist operation, an act of genocide and massacre and amounts to a declaration of war,” Nasrallah

said. “The only way to return the displaced to the north is to stop the aggression on the Gaza Strip and the West Bank. What you are doing will increase the displacement of the displaced from the north and will remove the opportunity for their return,” Nasrallah said. The last two days of explosions in Lebanon, triggered remotely with explosives inside pagers or walkie-talkies, have killed at least 37 people and wounded 2,931, Lebanese Health Minister Firass Al-Abyad said in a press conference Thursday. Prior to announcing the strikes, Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu restated his intention of returning tens of thousands of displaced Israelis to their homes in the north of the country, parts of which have been emptied by the threat of Hezbollah attacks. Two IDF soldiers were killed by Hezbollah rockets in the north on Thursday, the army said. Defense Minister Yoav Gallant, meanwhile, said the “center of gravity” of Israel’s 11-month-old war against Hamas and its backers “is shifting” from the Gaza Strip to the

northern border with Lebanon. The Israeli rhetoric was punctuated by the two waves of explosions in Lebanon. Pager devices exploded on Tuesday prompting chaos in the capital Beirut and across the Hezbollah militant group’s southern heartland. On Wednesday, walkie-talkies exploded, some during funeral processions being held for militants killed in Tuesday’s explosions. An ABC News source confirmed that Israel was behind the Tuesday pager attacks. Israeli leaders have not publicly commented on either round of explosions. The Lebanese Health Ministry said 12 people were killed and 2,323 wounded in Tuesday’s pager detonations, and another 25 people were killed and 608 wounded in Wednesday’s walkie-talkie blasts, according to Al-Abyad. Family and loved ones of Jayda Woods-Johnson – the 13-year-old girl killed in a shooting at Alderwood Mall in Lynnwood a little more than two months ago – say they’re upset with a judge’s ruling on the bail for the suspected shooter, 16-year-old Samuel Gizaw. “Samuel Gizaw is a danger to our community,” said Cheryl Huffman, Jayda’s cousin. Prosecutors say Gizaw retaliated after getting punched near the mall’s food court, firing a shot toward a group of teen boys running away, as Woods-Johnson was hit by the bullet while walking with a friend. Huffman says, on one hand, the family is pleased the judge decided to keep Gizaw’s bail at \$2 million after his attorney asked for a reduction to \$790,000. But they’re disappointed the judge is allowing Gizaw’s

family to use their home – valued at up to nearly \$1.1 million – as collateral. Defense attorney Bryan Hershman asked for a property bond during last week’s bail hearing. “There will be at least two eyes on this young man at all times, more than that, four or six or eight eyes at all time to include mom and dad who have sort of created a shift for their own work so that one or the two of them can be home 24/7,” said Hershman. Under the court’s ruling, if released, Gizaw is not allowed to leave home, except for medical or legal appointments. “I think it was 24 people who wrote letters on behalf of Samuel, stating he’s this outstanding child and that he is well-received in the community.
